INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. International Women's Day (IWD) has occurred for well over a century, with the first IWD gathering in 1911.

As part of the 2020 global celebrations we will be running some fantastic flagship events across Wales which you can see on page 6 but we want to help everyone get involved in International Women's Day.

1: NO TIME, BUT WANT TO JOIN IN THE CELEBRATIONS ON MARCH 8TH?

CELEBRATE AN INSPIRATIONAL WOMAN IN YOUR LIFE

#WelshShero #100WelshWomen

Celebrate an awesome woman in your life. Need inspiration? Check out our 100 Welsh Women website, 100welshwomen.wales, to see some incredible women from Welsh history and from contemporary times.

MAKE A PLEDGE AND SHARE IT ON SOCIAL MEDIA

Ask your colleagues and friends to pledge support to change something for women this International Women's day on March 8th.

At the end of this toolkit you will see a printable 'pledge card.' Print it out and write your pledge for #IWD2020. If you are based in a workplace, encourage all your colleagues to make a pledge. You could also come together in one place and take a photo of you all holding your pledge up showing your support for women's rights and the push for gender equality.

Here are some example pledges:

I pledge to celebrate amazing women everyday

I pledge to call out sexism wherever I see it or hear it

I pledge to campaign on the gender pay gap

I pledge to push for more diverse teams

Your pledge can be anything you will do to support equality for women – the important thing is that you make the pledge and share it on social media and tag us in @WENWales.

Think about what you as an organisation or you as an individual can pledge AND how you will follow up on the pledge to achieve it!

2: UP FOR DOING MORE?

If you have a bit more time, and want to put on an event or similar, here are some ideas:

- **Host a panel discussion** on an issue close to your heart. It can be about ANYTHING! But plan your event early and get the local press involved in publicising it or share it early with your colleagues if you plan to organise it at work or school. Successful events that have been held in the past included:
 - Women in Leadership: the future
 - Sported – how to get more teenage girls involved in sport
 - Women's rights post #MeToo
 - Women and Tech: is AI Sexist?
- **Host an International Women's Day café** at work or school and use our 100 Welsh Women list to discuss inspirational women, or invite one of them to come and chat to you (100welshwomen.wales);
- **Invite a representative from the WEN Wales team**, ambassadors or our board to come and speak at your event;
- **Organise a feminist film screening** and host a Q&A session discussing the topics raised in the film;
- **Work with creative organisations to hold an exhibition** or performance by women or works focused on themes around gender equality;
- **Host a book fayre, book club or signing** featuring the work of an inspirational feminist author;
- **Share the love** – blog, post or share any activity you attend using the hashtags #IWD2020 #WelshShero
- **Join WEN Wales** if you are not already a member!
